The Omega Women's Leadership Center is pleased to announce that scholarships are available for **Say What You Mean, Be Who You Are,** a workshop for young women, at Omega Institute, August 10–12, 2012. The workshop is open to **young women ages** 18 to 24.

Now, more than ever, there is an opportunity for young women to realize their greatest potential and have their voices heard in the global dialogue, which will promote a climate of justice, compassion, and sustainability. These voices need to be encouraged, not stifled by the pressure to be a "good girl"—unerringly compliant, modest, and selfless.

In this workshop, we will encourage young women to develop self-awareness and personal authority, qualities that are essential for meeting life's challenges. In a fun and supportive setting, we will engage in activities ranging from journal writing and meditation to role-play and discussion. Young women leave with practical skills to express their thoughts and feelings and advocate for themselves in relationships and the world.

This workshop is led by Rachel Simmons, author of the *New York Times* best sellers *Odd Girl Out* and *The Curse of the Good Girl: Raising Authentic Girls With Courage and Confidence.*Cofounder and program director of the Girls Leadership Institute, Simmons works with schools and organizations around the world. A leadership development consultant for the Center for Work and Life at Smith College, she has appeared on the *Oprah Winfrey Show* and is a frequent contributor to the *Today Show*.

This scholarship covers the following:

- Full or partial cost of tuition for the workshop.
- Accommodations and meals at the Omega Dining Hall)Commuter scholarships are also available.)
- The Omega shuttle bus from and to New York City, if needed.
- Participants are able to take time for personal reflection in our Sanctuary, relax and unwind in our sauna, and visit our extensive collection on holistic studies at the Ram Dass Library. Eliaibility

Scholarships are awarded to women who will bring a diversity of background and experience to the event; to women who want to leverage their experience and apply what they learn in their schools, workplace, and communities; and to women who would not be able to afford to attend the event without the scholarship.

In general, Omega considers an applicant eligible for scholarship if her income or that of her family is not more than 2.5 times the Federal Poverty level as set forth in the United States Federal Guidelines. Please see the table below to determine your financial eligibility.
